Langley attends pre-law seminar

DURHAM -- Incoming first-year N.C. Central University law student DeWarren K. Langley was selected to attend the 2008 Council on Legal Education Opportunity/Thurgood Marshall Attitude is Essential Pre-Law Seminar held recently at the Renaissance Concourse Hotel in Atlanta, and was certified as a CLEO/Thurgood Marshall Associate.

As a certified associate, Langley is eligible to receive academic support services and stipends.

The seminar was funded through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education and designed to familiarize students who are already admitted to law school with the demands associated with the first year of law school and to acquaint them with resources available to help them meet those demands. The workshop sessions and accompanying handout materials cover such topics as legal analysis and writing, legal education financing, debt management, class preparation, the Socratic Method, case briefing and so forth.

Langley says, "AIE was a realistic exposure to the study of law while affording me the opportunity to learn a wealth of knowledge which will prove to be invaluable in the fall."

Langley will be a first-year law student at the NCCU School of Law in August.
